	South Africa's turbulent past and, today, is home to the country's Constitutional Court, which endorses the rights of all citizens.
12:43-14:03	Recommended stop No.6 (2hours) Hop off at Mining District - Main Street Mall runs along the heart of Johannesburg's corporate mining district. It's home to the offices of some of the world's largest mining companies and along the street is a very informative outdoor museum that portrays the history and legacy of mining in South Africa. Recommended lunch venue: Rand Club is within a walking distance from Mining District Stop - Rand Club has a wonderful restaurant located on the ground floor Main Bar. The restaurant is open for both Members and outside guests (with a reservation).
14:26-16:26	Recommended stop No.7 Explore the Apartheid Museum guided tour, Explore the Apartheid Museum- A visit to this renowned museum is second to none in exemplifying the rise and fall of apartheid, it narrates a touching story of the triumph of the human spirit over adversity, beginning in 1948 right through to the liberation in 1994 when Nelson Mandela was elected president of the republic

DAY 3	<i>Art Gallery Exploration in the City</i>
08:45	Pick up at the Convention Venue
09:00-10:30	Visit the Artily Art Gallery at the Nelson Mandela Square in Sandton, Johannesburg. This art gallery is dedicated to showcasing a dynamic range of artworks by artists at various

	stages of their careers. Driven by a passion for contemporary African art and a commitment to empowering its artists to succeed, the gallery serves as a vibrant hub for art enthusiasts, collectors, and visitors. It celebrates the rich diversity of African art through thought-provoking exhibitions that challenge conventions and highlight the unique perspectives and creative voices of its artists.
11:30-12:45	Visit the Johannesburg Art Gallery (JAG). Situated within the inner city of Johannesburg. Recently renovated, this gallery, built over 100 years ago, is the oldest museum of its kind in the city, and boasts a collection of over 10 000 artworks. In addition to robust historical and Southern African cultural collections, the 'JAG' as it is affectionately known, also houses a growing contemporary collection. Exhibitions run for an average of 3 months and showcase works from the collections as well as work from local and international contemporary artists.
13:15-14:15	Visit the Everard Read Gallery in Rosebank. Noted as Africa's oldest commercial art gallery, it is renowned for its rich history and commitment to fine art. Established in 1913 along a dusty street in the young mining town of Johannesburg, the gallery has evolved into a prestigious institution, showcasing modern and contemporary works from Southern Africa's most distinguished artists. Over the decades, Everard Read has played a pivotal role in shaping the South African art scene, celebrating its centenary in 2013 while continuing to foster artistic excellence and innovation. Take a walk across from Everard Read to the Keys Art Mile Gallery, also situated in Rosebank.

14:30 Minimum 1 Hour	Lunch at Proud Mary restaurant in Rosebank. This restaurant offers a modern mid-century-inspired all-day eatery and wine bar to suit every taste.
15:30-16:30	Visit the Rosebank Arts and Crafts Market . This market in the heart of Rosebank, Johannesburg is set to give visitors the vibrance of a truly African marketplace filled with a warm energy and rhythm. The experience of a marketplace offering an assortment of artifacts, beading, wiring, sculptures, gifting options and paintings representative of African heritage.
17:00	Shuttle/Bus back to Sandton.
DAY 4	<i>Museums in the City and Soweto Township Experience</i>
08:15	Pick up from Conference Venue
09:15-10:30	Visit Museum Africa. Situated in the heart of the Newtown Cultural Precinct, it is the Johannesburg's leading history museum which was the first purpose-built fruit and vegetable market building in 1913, and set to be, at the time, a fine example of the advances made in industrial building techniques. In 1990 the market building was imaginatively adapted to house Museum Africa, a new museum that opened its doors in 1994 the year of South Africa's non-racial, democratic elections. The Museum offers a variety of programs to enrich the classroom experience. Visitors will explore the archaeological and early geology of Johannesburg which are permanent exhibitions of the Museum.
11:15-12:30	Visit the Nelson Mandela House Museum . Located on the iconic Vilakazi Street in Orlando West in Soweto, the Nelson Mandela National Museum, known as Mandela House, is a historic site that served as the home of Nelson Mandela from 1946 to 1962. Today, it stands as a powerful tribute to his legacy,

	offering visitors a glimpse into his early life and the struggle for freedom that shaped South Africa's history.
13:00-14:30	Lunch at Meet Meat in Vilakazi Street, Soweto. Originally a butchery and Shisa-nyama situated in the township of Soweto. A true South African food experience gem, where visitors are bound to experience a relaxed ambiance, lively music, good food encompassing of what is called a true African Braai meal, encompassing grilled meats on fire, achar and pap, a visit to this establishment will make guests to feel at home.
15:00-16:00	Visit the Hector Pietersen Memorial and Museum . Situated in Orlando West, Soweto, the Hector Pieterse Memorial and Museum stands as a powerful tribute to the brave students who took part in the 1976 Soweto Uprising. Located just two blocks from the site where 12-year-old Hector Pieterse was tragically shot and killed on 16 June 1976, the museum honours his legacy and that of countless others who fought against apartheid. Through compelling exhibits, photographs and personal accounts, it provides visitors with a moving insight into South Africa's struggle for freedom and the resilience of its youth.

DAY 5	<i>Origins of Humanity Complimentary Attractions Tour</i>
08:15	Pick up from the Convention/ Symposium Venue
09:30- 11:00 Minimum Duration 1-hour 30mins	Visit the Maropeng Visitor Centre , an award winning-world class exhibition, focusing on the development of humans and our ancestors over the past few million years. See fossils, learn about how humankind was born, view stone tools that are up to one million years old, and much more. 15:10 – 16h30 Minimum 1 and a half hour.	Visit the Cradle of Humankind . Named and curated after its most sought out designer, Mr. Thebetsile Magugu, the winner of the 2019 LVMH Young Fashion Designer Prize and 2021 finalist in the International Woolmark Prize.



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	Magugu makes use of recycled material to create new and fashionable clothing items/pieces, some of his key clothing items are made from discarded denim pieces Thebe saw in clothing bins in Johannesburg Downtown and was inspired to create new designs.
12:30-13:30	Lunch at Saint German at 44 Stanley Avenue. This French-inspired café and eatery is owned and run by French-Congolese designer Marien Mel, offering the perfect spot to enjoy a drink or glass of wine and do a little people watching through amazing meals.
14:15-15:55	Explore 44 Stanley Avenue . This is the most established precinct on the edge of downtown Joburg, providing a mixed-use development that fuses downtown urbanism with a subtle sophistication. Within the centre lies a mix of carefully curated, bespoke textile and fashion-oriented stores offering an authentic urban living experience that runs through eating, drinking, shopping, working and living experiences in the City of Johannesburg.

11:45-12:50	Lunch at Insights Restaurant in Sanctuary Mandela – the restaurant offers a place to enjoy and share delicious meals with friends and family, just like Madiba loved to. In memory of his love for food, our restaurant serves as a tribute to his favourite dishes.
13:30-15:00	Visit and explore the Johannesburg Genocide and Holocaust Centre , which honours the memory of the victims of genocide in the 20th century and teaches about the consequences of prejudice and hate speech to prevent the recurrence of mass atrocities and genocide in all its forms.

DAY 1	<i>Soweto Township Experience</i>
Minimum 1 hour	Start your day at The Credo Mutwa Cultural Village is one of Soweto's many gems, and a must to see for visitors from all over the world who want a taste of deep African cultures and beliefs combined with modern ideas. This is an outdoor exhibition area that is combined with a museum style, showcasing the works and inspiration of Credo Mutwa. Credo Mutwa was an artist and a traditional healer that has been actively creating pieces of art for decades.
Minimum 2 hour	Visit an exciting horse ride at the Soweto Equestrian Centre - The tour supports disadvantaged children and the welfare of horses. The Soweto horse riding tour is an amazing experience and an opportunity to take a horse ride through the Soweto Equestrian Centre for an hour.
Minimum 1 hour	Experience Soweto through a bicycle tour with BOOK IBHONI , a tour company that offers fun educational bicycle tours amongst other activities in around the historic township or Orlando in Soweto
Minimum 1 hour	Park the bicycles and have lunch at Sakhumzi Restaurant : The Restaurant is situated on the popular & historic Vilakazi Street, in Orlando West, suburb of Soweto in Johannesburg. The cuisine is African township whilst the ambience aspires to complement heritage tourism theme.



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Minimum 1 hour	After lunch visit Nelson Mandela Museum - Commonly referred to as Mandela House, the house is on Vilakazi Street, Orlando West, Soweto, where Nelson Mandela lived from 1946 to 1962. It is located at number 8115, at the corner of Vilakazi and Ngakane streets, a short distance up the road from Tutu House, the home of Archbishop Emeritus Desmond Tutu. Mandela donated the house to the Soweto Heritage Trust of which he was the founder on 1st September 1997, to be run as a museum. It was declared a National Heritage Site in 1999

Minimum 1 hour	Start the day with a visit to Origins Centre Museum , the world's only museum dedicated to exploring and celebrating the history of modern humankind. The Museum provides visitors with a unique experience of Africa's rich, complex heritage and boasts an extensive collection of rock art from the Wits Rock Art Research Institute.
Minimum 1 hour	Visit the Constitution Hill precinct which tells the fascinating, often tragic, story of real South African history in which injustices abounded on social, cultural, and political levels. It was once the prison that the famous political freedom icons such as Nelson Mandela and Mahatma Gandhi were incarcerated in the Old Fort Prison Complex, commonly known as Number Four during the apartheid era.
Minimum 2 hour	Lunch at Pata Pata – located at the exciting and vibey neighborhoods, Maboneng. Pata Pata uses fresh South African ingredients and highlights SA favourites such as morogo, idombolo, potjie and more. The boboti springrolls have all the flavour, spice, and comfort of traditional South African boboti encased in crisp springroll pastry with a tangy sweet chilli sauce.

Minimum 1 hour	After lunch meet Bheki Dube, the founder of main district walk that offers amazing walking tours of Maboneng precinct . The tour provides an exclusive opportunity to learn more about the Eastern side of the Inner City. Maboneng meaning “Place of Light” is a fully integrated urban neighbourhood on the east side of Johannesburg CBD. Both a mixed-use development and urban community, Maboneng is home to several independent retail, restaurants, and entertainment venues as well as loft apartments, offices, film and sound studios, a hotel, a hostel, a museum, and creative factory space

DAY 3	<i>Fun and Adventure In the City</i>
Minimum 1 hour	Start the day with a visit to Museum of Illusions in Rosebank - Brace yourself for a reality-bending experience! Come experience optical illusions like never before, with more than 60 mind-bending, immersive exhibits, interactive displays and a party room for all your celebrations! It’s all about challenging your perception and exploring the science behind how our brains interpret reality.
Minimum 1 hour	Visit The Inside Out Centre for the Arts in Johannesburg's Forest Town, founded in 2023 by Roger Ballen. The centre combines art exhibitions which explore African themes with educational talks and programs.
Minimum 1 hour	Visit the Johannesburg Genocide and Holocaust Centre , which honors the memory of the victims of genocide in the 20th century and teaches about the consequences of prejudice and hate speech so as to prevent the recurrence of mass atrocities and genocide in all its forms. The permanent exhibition, which opened in March 2019, is a fascinating exploration of genocide in 20th Century world history through photography, film, personal testimonies and particularly poignantly, the everyday personal effects left behind by

	victims such as clothing, jewellery and keepsakes. Survivors from both the Holocaust and the Rwandan genocide have been deeply involved in the centre since it's founding by Tali Nates whose father was saved from the Nazi death camps by Oskar Schindler. Pre booking is essential
Minimum 1 hour	Lunch at Salvation Café at 44 Stanley - this cafe is a down-to-earth daytime café that preaches the soul of good food; food that is fresh and honest. Always included as one of Jozi's favorite eating spots
Minimum 1 hour	Visit Lindfield Victorian House Museum , a monument to Victorian life (with some Edwardian references) presided over by Katherine Love, who has spent a lifetime collecting everyday objects from the Victorian era. Love lives in the house, which was built in 1910, and greets visitors dressed as a Victorian parlour maid, taking them through the museum in character and helping them to imagine life in Johannesburg 100 years ago.

Minimum 2 hour	Visit the exhibition at the Maropeng Visitor Centre, an exciting, world-class exhibition, focusing on the development of humans and our ancestors over the past few million years. On arrival, you will see a massive burial mound called the Tumulus, which is your entrance to learning the secrets of our ancestry.
Minimum 2 hours	Drive to Bothongo Rhino & Lion Nature Reserve - a privately-owned game reserve covering some 1200 hectares. Visitors can expect to see in excess of 650 head of game including some very rare and endangered species. The reserve falls within the Cradle of Humankind World Heritage Site.
Minimum 1 hour	Lunch at Neck & Deck Restaurant at Bothongo Rhino & Lion Nature Reserve - An open air restaurant with surrounding views of animals including a giraffe.
